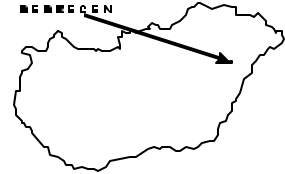

Getting acquainted

This month, I want to introduce you to the other one of the men in the church here in Debrecen. His name is Nándor Cséti. He is twenty-eight years old. He became a Christian on September 4, 1995.

Nándor came into contact with the church through the English Bible School in 1992. He attended first for the English but he became more interested in the Bible during the classes. Following the school, he went to the university of economics in Budapest. While in Budapest, he attended the congregation there. After finishing with a degree in economics in the field of Logistics, he returned to Debrecen and decided to commit his life to Christ.

He has preached and has taught since then. He has mostly taught in Debrecen and Budapest. When asked, he goes to the other cities to help. He has taught in the English Bible schools in Debrecen and Nyíregyháza.

He has a young sister and brother. They and his parents still have not committed themselves to the Lord. His family is atheist. Although, the family has both Catholicism and Reformed church in their history.

From 1992, Nándor had a call to be single. He felt that God had called him to be single. That was until last August when God changed his heart and mind, through much prayer. He opened him to the idea of marriage. Since then, God made many opportunities for him to change. Since January, he has been dating Angela Knox. They plan to get married in the near future but no time is set. college loans are paid. Following this, they will return to Hungary to work and continue to help the church here grow and multiple. If they work and pay them off then they will better be able to serve without the worries of finances.
